She also directed 120 Under 40, a program that recognizes young researchers, practitioners and advocates in reproductive health worldwide. She has also worked in communications at Notre Dame of Maryland University, her alma mater; as a writer at a web design agency; and as an editor at a monthly magazine.

Marianne has a Master of Arts degree in science writing from Johns Hopkins University, and her writing has appeared in Johns Hopkins Magazine, The Baltimore Sun, and other regional and national publications. She is a native of Baltimore City and lives in Highlandtown with her husband and daughter.
